All applicants for the Non-resident Peregrine Trapping Permit drawing must possess a falconry permit from their home state equivalent to a Texas general or master falconry permit. A non-resident shall not trap more than one raptor per permit year (July 1 – June 30) in this state.

The Peregrine trapping season is September 20th through October 20th. **Applications must be received by the department no later than the close of business on March 31st.** Late arrivals will not be eligible. All applicants will be notified, via email, of the drawing results no later than April 15th.

I hereby certify that the above information is true and correct. I have read and understand the rules pertaining to a non-resident raptor trapping permit. I understand that falsifying information on this form will be cause for permit denial or revocation. Furthermore, I understand a raptor trapping permit may be granted at the discretion of the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department and may be revoked at any time for failure to comply with the regulations of the department or with any terms of the permit. This application does not constitute authority to capture or to hold native raptors in Texas for any purpose other than for use in the sport of falconry, or to capture raptors listed by the department as threatened or endangered, unless otherwise authorized by permit stipulation.
