#### Legend

To the right of each bird species name are five columns representing the status of each species at Old Tunnel.

- PR – Permanent Resident
- FO – Flyover (seen overhead only)
- WR – Winter Resident
- M – Migrant
- SR – Summer Resident

If a species has been seen on the area during any of the four time periods, the column will contain a letter which indicates the abundance or rarity of sightings of that species. This information will assist you in determining the probability of your identification.

- A – Abundant (seen on nearly every visit)
- C – Common (seen on a regular basis)
- U – Uncommon (can be present, but found inconsistently)
- R – Rare (seen once every few years)
